Teleos Christian Schools Graduation Requirements

We earnestly believe every student should strive to complete a course of study which prepares them for college or employment after graduation. However age, aptitude, interests or skills may prevent a student from completing with Honors or a College Preparatory Diploma. A lack of ability or late transfer into a program may prevent a reasonable age- for graduation.

A student is officially in high school when their paces reach 1097 in all subjects. When a student reaches age 14 and is still working below pace 1084 it is best that they pursue the Vocational course of study. In most cases students are working two years below grade level. With this being the case, a student will have approximately 3 to 4 years of school years remaining before his age consummates his graduation date.

The three essential areas for Graduation

- 1. It is very important to understand that Teleos Christian Schools does not graduate students based upon Academics alone
- 2. It is mandatory that because we are a Christian School we require students to display **consistent moral Character**. Furthermore if the child has problems with the Parental/Guardian Authority they would not be permitted to Graduate.
 - a. If Children are rebellious to their parents they will not be allowed to graduate unless that most important relationship is intact. The Bible is very clear that "Children are to obey their parents" (Eph. 6:1-3)
 - b. No graduate that is known to be practicing immorality will be permitted to graduate no matter how academically intelligent they are. Students that are known to be drinking alcohol, taking drugs, involved in sexual activity, homosexuality, lesbianism or any such like that fall into the category of immorality will not be permitted to graduate. Each case, however, is to be examined on an individual basis. (1 Cor. 6:9-11)
 - c. We are responsible in as much as possible for knowing that our students are moral in their conduct. Hence, we require that we as well as Parents/Guardians have access to these internet sites to ensure that all things on the sites are becoming of the Lord Jesus Christ. It is also a requirement of our school that the parents verify that they check their child's internet sites. (Psalm 26:2)

3. It is also mandatory that a potential Graduate be involved spiritually in their church. A life without God and His house is not highly valued by God or Teleos Christian Schools. The Administration of Teleos refuses to bow to popular trends and notions that are contrary to God. Our Goal is to hear God's "Well done" at the end of our lives even if that means we suffer for it. What matters most is not Your Talent, not Your Athleticism but your CHARACTER in the sight of God. The bottom line is "Character Counts" at Teleos Christian School

Teleos Christian School offers three courses of studies:

Leaving Certificate

This means that the Student is not able to fulfill vocational Preparatory Diploma requirements. This is basically an Attendance Certificate.

Vocational Diploma

Students will have received the basic learning requirements to get a job. However students may not be able to get into college with this Diploma. –Completion of vocational course will result in a diploma stamped "Vocational Preparatory." This requires at least 18 credits. In order to complete the vocational track the student must complete courses in each subject at least through Pace 1096. This means that the student suffers from academic deficiencies and thus make a general course of study impossible.

College Preparatory

Students will be able to get into college if they successfully fulfill all these requirements. The student will work well in college. This program is the course of study for a standard High School Diploma prescribed. This requires at least 22 credits

Honors

Students will be able to get into college if they successfully fulfill all requirements. The students will work exceptionally well in college. This honors program includes Teleos Highest Quality preparation for College education. An Honor student must complete at least 24 credits with 94 percent average. They must also demonstrate the ability to communicate effectively in written and oral presentations
